Reservice of medical personnel with an enemy power.

Dear sirs. Reference is made to our letter of 8th inst. in the above matter.

he may inform you that we have today received from mr. Arvid Holt-Seeland a copy of his latter to you of January 6th regarding the service og Norwegian medical personnel with the German army.

when mr. Seeland v isited our office some days ago, we said that even though we could not in any way prevent him from writing to you direct we were of opinion that the correct procedure would be for the Nor--wegish Red Cross to write the letter to the International Red Cross Committee, with a copy for mr. Rolt-Seeland, and we understood him to agree than this.

If Mr. Holt-Seeland prefers to take the matter up with you direct, he is at liberty to do so, but we shall then consider any further interventions in the matter on the part sof the Norwegian Med Gross, as superfluous. We should, however, like to be kept informed of your enswer to mr. Holt-Seeland.

As for Mr. Holt-Seeland 's remarks on page 2, section II, we want to protest against his quotation of the undersigned's statement, and we made this clear to mr. Holt-Seeland during his visit. We remember, that a telephone call was put through from the rolice to the General Secretary of the Horwegian Hed Gross, as to what the Police was going to do with the Horwegian nurses returning from service with the German army. There was no claim for Hed Gross protection. The Secretary General answered that this would be a matter of Norwegian law, and consequently up to the Norwegian authorities to decide, and that it did not concern the Norwegian Hed Gross. The Secretary General did not, of course, encourage the police to put the nurses in gaol, which seems to appear from Mr. Holt-Seeland's quotation.

As f or the rest, we refer to our previous correspondence in this matter.
