**DETAILS OF BUILDING
PROGRAMME**

BERLIN, MAY 17

The official *German Naval Gazette* gives the strength of the German Navy on April 1, 1936, as follows:—

BATTLESHIPS (three).—Deutschland, Admiral Scheer, Admiral Graf Spee. Under construction (two).—Ersatz Elsaas and Ersatz Essen. To these are added the three old ships Hannover, Schlesien, and Schleswig-Holstein.

CRUISERS (six).—Emden, Königsberg, Karlsruhe, Köln, Leipzig, Nürnberg. Under construction (three).—Ersatz Berlin, Ersatz Hamburg, and "J."

DESTROYERS.—Sixteen under construction.

TORPEDO-BOATS (19).—T 155, T 190, T 196, G 7, G 8, G 10, G 11, Möwe, Greif, Seeadler, Albatros, Kondor, Falke, Wolf, Iltis, Tiger, Luchs, Jaguar, Leopard.

SUBMARINES (19).—U 1 to U 15, U 17 to U 20. Building (17).—U 16, U 21 to U 36.

The list includes three existing fleet escort vessels and seven under construction; 29 minesweepers, 20 other vessels, and four under construction; an unspecified number of speed-boats, observation, and other craft; two artillery training ships; five artillery training boats; the surveying ship Meteor; the school sailing vessel Gorch Föck; the submarine escort ship Saar, and a number of vessels for special purposes.
