My dear friend,

Lysaker, April 2nd 30.

it was so very nice to get your card from Taormina. How I wished I could have been there with you. But I have to remain in my bed, and have been there for more than a month now. I am not really allowed to write yet, but must nevertheless send you a few lines. I was suddenly and quite unexpectedly attacked by phlebitis (Aderentzündung) in one leg, and was laid up on my back. Then after a week or more I had a blood-clot in one lung, and it was a little serious. Now I am much better, but shall have to remain in bed for three or four weeks more, lying on my back and must not move. Rather tiresome, but patience, and it will be all right again I hope. The worst is I cannot work, and can make no real use of the time. But now enough about myself.

Sigrun would have written to you long ago, but unfortunately just a few days after I got ill, she fell and broke her right arm. She is improving all right now, but cannot write. She wishes me to send you her warmest greetings, and she also asks me to mention some seeds of some flowers for her rock-garden which I understand that she had seen with you, and which you thought could be sent to her.

I hope you are all of you quite well and have a lovely spring. My cordial greetings to Sulzer, my love to the boys and yourself.
